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COVID 19 Update

The management and staff of the school are very appreciative of the efforts that parents are making to make our school a safe place for all our pupils and staff. Many schools, including our own, have had to send entire classes or class pods home, due to positive COVID 19 cases. We can all do our best to minimise the chances of this happening again if we continue to follow these guidelines:

- ✓ Stay at home if you or your children have any symptoms. See poster below. Get advice from your doctor about the need for testing for yourself or your children.
- ✓ If your child is named as a close contact of a confirmed case please follow HSE advice.
- ✓ Parents must wear face masks when on the school grounds. Staff wear facemasks in accordance with school regulations. Pupils are also welcome to use face masks.
- \checkmark Only pupils and staff are to enter the school building.
- ✓ Pupils stay in their own class bubbles some may be part of a second bubble.
- ✓ Pupils and staff continue to be vigilant about hand washing and hand sanitising.
- ✓ Pupils should have warm and rainproof clothing so that regular breaks for fresh air can continue to take place as the weather disimproves.

 ✓ Air monitors (11) have been delivered to the school and have been set up in a range of classrooms. We await the delivery of additional monitors that were promised.


And some more new language opportunities for our pupils
